In the meantime Sylvia Pringle and Rev. Boyar will interview the Chaplain at University of Jamestown, Presbyterian Pastor Candace Adams.
- The Presbyterian Church in Ellendale is hosting the Festival of Music on Sunday afternoon on Sept 24<sup>th</sup> at 4:00 pm.
- Rev. Boyar attended both funerals last week regarding the tragedy in Jamestown. Jim and Sue Bond are next door neighbors.
- Rev. Boyar thanks the deacons for the cake and ice cream social after service on his birthday.
- Rev. Boyar thanked all who attended the open house to meet their daughter, Kristina.
- Christian Education Coordinator search committee is comprised of Bev Schaack, Dale Reimers, Jim Bond, and Pastor Bob

Last weekend multiple white supremacist groups descended on Charlottesville, Virginia. Alt-right, white supremacist and neo-Nazi groups marched around a statue of Robert E. The mix was chaotic and dangerous – ending in three lives lost, multiple injuries and a community searching for ways to heal.

Vigils and protests sprung up around the country, Confederate statues were torn down or removed in various cities and leaders of all stripes offered opinions on what took place.

And, as one article in the Atlantic put it: "The next day was Sunday. And it mattered."

People went to the pews searching to make sense of what they'd seen on the screen or witnessed in person.
