Prayer is seeking to respond and connect to that being and reality, even if it is no more than calling out into the air for help.

I think it takes a lot of courage and a lot of faith to come together week after week and say YES! To hope, peace, joy, and love. We look around at this broken world; at the violence, the poverty, the suffering, yet again and again we gather as a community of faith and say YES! to God.



Christians have faith in the God who plants seeds of hope, peace, joy, and love into each and every situation; each and every life. Forward of Celebrate Recovery

You may think recovery is only for drug addicts and alcoholics- people whose lives seem out of control. But that's just not true. The Bible teaches that all of us have addictions in our lives. Sin is addicting, and the Bible says, "all have sinned." Not one of us is perfect. We've all blown it; we've all made mistakes. We've hurt ourselves, we've hurt other people, and others have hurts us.

Because of sin, each of us needs repentance and recovery in order to live the way God intended. That's why, years ago, we at Saddleback developed a Biblical recovery program based on the Beatitudes of Jesus. We named the program Celebrate Recovery.

The goal of the Celebrate Recovery program is not simply to recover from past sins and hurts. The goal is to become Christ-like in our character. To date, over 9,000 hurting people have participated in Celebrate Recovery at Saddleback Church, and have experiences a Biblically balanced approach to repentance and recovery.

So, no matter what situation you find yourself in, here's good news: regardless of whether your problem is emotional, financial, relational, spiritual, sexual or whatever, regardless of what you need help with, *God wants to help you*.

In Isaiah 57:18-19 God says of his people that he has seen how they acted but he will heal them, he will lead them and will comfort those who mourn. So, God know us. He knows where we came from, where we stand today, and where we are going to be tomorrow. And He says:

If you've been hurt, "I want to heal you."

If you're confused, "I want to lead you."

If you've ever felt you were helpless to change anything, "I want to help you."

If you've ever felt no one understands your problem, "I want to comfort you."

If you feel worried or afraid, "I want to offer peace to you,"

The reality is that you're not going to get well on your own. Persistent temptations must be team-tackled through community. We need each other. Trying to fix your problems on your own only makes them worse than they were when you started. But there's hope. God is ready and waiting to help you if you let him.

I'm excited that you're beginning the journey to recovery. Your life will change. You'll experience freedom from your sinful hurts, hang-ups, and habits as you give up control and allow Jesus to be Lord in every area of your life.

Janice was born in Delhi, NY; she received her early education at Delaware Academy and Central School. She went to State University of New York (SUNY) at Alfred, NY and some at their branch in Delhi. She worked at Lounsbary Flowers, College Town, Ithaca, NY; then attended the Institute of Photography in New York City. While working at Bloomingdales Portrait Studio she met Claire from Montana. Claire's boyfriend was from Jamestown and Janice drove with them when the boyfriend bought the Photography Studio in Jamestown then owned by our own local Phyllis Ibes. She worked at that studio for a couple years in the late 1960's as well as at Don's House Of Flowers during holiday times.
