Sharing Christ's Love Through Service

Valentine's Day

According to Catholic Online, "the origin of St. Valentine, and how many St. Valentines there were, remains a mystery. One opinion is that he was a Roman martyred for refusing to give up his Christian faith. Other historians hold that St. Valentine was a temple priest jailed for defiance during the reign of Claudius. In 496 AD Pope Gelasius marked February 14th as a celebration in honor of his martyrdom. The first representation of Saint Valentine appeared in The Nuremberg Chronicle, a great illustrated book printed in 1493. Alongside a woodcut portrait of him, the text states that Valentinus was a Roman priest martyred during the reign of Claudius II. Since he was caught marrying Christian couples and aiding any Christians who were being persecuted under Emperor Claudius in Rome, Valentinus was arrested and imprisoned. Claudius took a liking to this prisoner—until Valentinus made a strategic error: he tried to convert the Emperor—whereupon this priest was condemned to death. He was beaten with clubs and stoned; when that didn't do it, he was beheaded outside the Flaminian Gate [circa 269]"

- Elder. An elected representative in a local church who is ordained to carry out duties of governing and spiritual care.
- Local church. The individual congregation (i. e. United Presbyterian) to which people belong.
- Session. The group of elders who have spiritual and governmental oversight in a local church.
- Deacon. An ordained office in a local church charged with ministries of care, witness, and service.
- Ordination. A biblical practice of setting a person apart for a form of ministry or service to God. The church ordains leaders who will serve the church in various ways.



General Assembly (GA) \$ 8.95 Synod of Lakes & Prairies \$ 5.40 Northern Plains Presbytery \$ 31.65 \$ 46.00

The 2019 apportionment is based on a church's membership as of December 31, 2017, as reported in the 2017 General Assembly Minutes (Part II, Statistics).
