



Session Highlights November 2019

- 7 Youth attended the lock-in from Jamestown, 23 youth signed up from Fargo.
- Youth helped with clean up of the Potato Bar Fundraiser, Kiwanis Kids Against Hunger, and going to Ave Maria Village for fellowship with the residents. Youth also helped out with clean up at the Thankful Dinner.
- Confirmation youth are also underway making fleece tie blankets for those that are homeless. There have been a lot of generous donations from the congregation.
- Confirmation is learning the Old Testament. We have learned material from Genesis to Babylonian Exile and have incorporated a church scavenger hunt for them to learn the history behind this church.
- The Christmas program is underway with the older kids learning the narrator parts and the younger kids learning the songs and trying on costumes.
- Rachel has met with the youth connection team of the Northern Plains and we have discussed future events such as summer mission trip, Crystal Springs Retreat, and Snow Camp.
- High school youth is meeting on Wednesday mornings at 8:30 AM at Babbs. Attendance ranges from 1 to 3 youth. Continuing to communicate with parents on the time and place and if there is a better option for youth to meet.
- Christian Nurture Committee: Recommended approve Snow Camp at Clearwater Forest on January 24th-26th and to cover the cost of any chaperone costs that it would come out of the youth fund.
- Rachel has been reaching out to teachers and parents to get goals set for the children in their schoolwork.
 Lana Meissner, the Jamestown Public School Literacy Coordinator, has offered grant money to the HERBB Tutoring Program for materials that help with literacy.
- Angie Allmer reported the pledge cards are coming in; Hopefully, automatic withdrawals will start January 1, 2020; a more detailed report will be obtained from Tammie Skari for the December meeting.
- The Red and Green pot-luck will be held after the Christmas program. Dixie Lee is calling workers for December 15, 2019.
- November 24, 2019, the church will be decorated for Advent/Christmas season following worship. The decorations will be removed and stored on January 6, 2019 after worship. Christmas Eve worship service will be at 5 PM on December 24, 2019.
- The Mission committee recommends, "to approve giving \$500 to the Salvation Army; \$3000 to the University of Jamestown; \$500 to Youth for Christ; \$1000 to Bdecan ministry; \$2000 to Presbyterian Disaster assistance; and \$500 to SAFE Shelter." MOTION CARRIED
- At the December session meeting, giving to Dorcas Ministry (Douglas Chimanga's ministry in Africa) will be on the agenda.

CHRISTMAS GIFT PROGRAM for STATE HOSPITAL PATIENTS

Volunteers at the State Hospital wish to give you all an opportunity to be "Family" to patients on Christmas. Here are a few suggestions which may be of interest to those individuals who wish to respond to this appeal:

For Men & Women: Hair brushes and combs, hair accessories, body wash, toothpaste, toothbrushes, shampoo, conditioner, deodorant and chap-stick.

For Women: Pajama sets, night gowns, lounge pants, panties, slippers, blouses or tops, sweat-shirts, sweatpants, socks, make-up (eye shadow, mascara, foundation, lipstick), lotions, nail polish, slipper socks, stretch gloves, winter hats, Christian devotionals, journals, book markers, notebooks (no spirals), planners and fleece throws.

<u>For Men:</u> Sweatshirts, sweatpants, hooded sweatshirts, colored t-shirts, socks, briefs/boxers, lounge pants, winter caps and gloves, billfolds, hand lotion, slippers, handkerchiefs, pajama sets, notebooks (no spirals), planners, playing cards, book markers, Christian devotionals, journals and fleece throws. We always run short of items for men.

<u>For Wards:</u> Games, supplies for arts and crafts (especially yarn and fuzzy posters), adult coloring books, crayons, colored pencils, colored markers, new boxes of all occasion greeting cards, stationary, Bibles, Christmas candy, calendars, blankets, and quilts.

<u>Please note:</u> Please **DO NOT** wrap gifts or give used clothing or used items, glass metal, aluminum, ceramic, breakable knick-knacks, books; or calendars with spiral binding, alcohol based perfumes, mouthwash or deodorant.

Our volunteers work with staff members to make sure patients receive suitable gifts (i.e. proper size, suitable items, etc.).

The unwrapped gift items need to be brought to the church by the first week of December. There will be a large box in the narthex to collect the items. Delivery will be made at the end of the first week in December.

Appreciation is expressed to all of you for your interest in the patients at the North Dakota State Hospital in Jamestown.
