#### From Where Does My Joy Come From?

Here is some good news. The year 2020 is coming to an end. Further good news is that God has been with us, is with us, and will continue to be with us. In the midst of all that has gone on locally, nationally, and globally our Lord Immanuel has guided us by God's grace to be the Church.

A personal piece of good news is that I am fully recovered from being tested positive for Covid 19. I would have rejoiced, but knowing that others are still languishing in it, I could only pray for their recovery too!

You too, I know have some good news to share. The word "Gospel" means "Good News." Recently I was on the phone talking with someone that was sharing some good news. I asked her on a scale of 1 to 10, 1 being unhappy and 10 being ecstatically joyful where would she place her happiness. Her response was, "well, it depends on the news of the day that I watch on television." She continued, "The talk of who gets the vaccine and when do they get it is upsetting. I don't hear things that will make me jump up for joy."

Joy seems almost irreverent in a world where so much is going wrong. We know people in the Jamestown area who are suffering with Covid 19. Some are in the hospital. Some have died. The agricultural economy continues to be stressed. People are not able to gather together as we want. It is hard to get jump-up-and-down joyful about any of that.

Only joy has never had very much to do with what is going on in the world at the time. That is what makes it different from happiness, or pleasure, or fun. All of those depend on positive conditions – good health, good job, happy family, lots of toys. Pleasure, as C.S. Lewis says is often in our power; joy never is. We know what activities commonly give us pleasure. Happiness covers a broad spectrum, from a fairly steady state of general contentment with one's life to special moments of delight and feeling good.

But here, Barbara Brown Taylor says, *The only condition for joy is the presence of God.* Joy happens when God is present and people know it, which means that it can erupt in a depressed economy, in the middle of a war, in an intensive care waiting room.

To be a Christian is to be always discovering the presence of God. As we near the twilight of our lives, it is increasingly easy to be bored, worldly-wise and sophisticated. Those are adjectives that mean we have lost the power of wonder and awe, to be surprised and delighted and amazed.

So what is it that the Christian needs to discover and appreciate? Simply life. Walter Burghardt says, *It is not that we blind ourselves to sin and war and disease and death. These touch us as cruelly as they touch the unbeliever. Still we can laugh, as the atheist and agnostic can never laugh; still there is a joy in our hearts no one can snatch from us. For in the very midst of death we have discovered life.* 

What is this life the Christian is constantly discovering? Simply the risen Jesus with his painful humanness and his glorious Godness. Where do we discover the risen Jesus? Perhaps we need to look in the shadows of our lives, among our doubts, fears and anxieties. This is not easy to do. If we can overcome our feelings of shame to look for Jesus in these corners of our hearts, we will be surprised.

The good news is that Jesus stands with us to forgive, to renew, to empower. God meets us and sees us through the darkest, coldest and most fearful of situations for ourselves and for those that God has placed in our midst.

There is good news. The year 2020 will soon be in the rear-view mirror. May we anticipate with joy the coming new year. May 2021 be a year that we experience not gloom and doom but the presence of God in our lives, this the joy we feel individually and as a community of faith at United Presbyterian Church in Jamestown, North Dakota.
