From the Pastor...

It's Lent once again. The 40-day season of Lent began on Ash Wednesday, February 17, 2021 and ends on April 3, the day before Easter Sunday, and serves as a time of preparation for celebrating the resurrection of Jesus Christ. Lent serves as a journey of new life. The forty days of Lent invite us to face our temptations and repent of our sin, but more deeply than merely admitting our wrongdoings and shortcomings. Repentance is not ego-bashing; it's turning away from the things in which we've sought life, that can't actually give life, and turning instead toward God, the Abundant Source.

As we know, the sermon series in the month of February was on love. We learned from I John 4 that love is a major characteristic of God: God is love. Because God loves us, we are to love one another. Yet the person who says, "The Christian faith can be summed up in just three words, God is love," has it only partially right. God is not only love, certainly not as we often use that wonderful and complicated word. God too, is commitment, faithfulness even when we are not faithful. So, the Old Testament frequently speaks, not just about the love of God, but the steadfast love of God. It is not a deep feeling that makes love Christian, but long-term endurance. Love is a gift of God, not a human achievement. So, we ask that we be given the grace to love one another as God has loved each of us in Christ – completely, with commitment, forever.

A good way to observe Lent is by means of the discipline of daily reading God's Word. The goal of reading the Bible is to get a fresh look at the things of God, and especially to get a fresh look at Jesus. As you read and study the Bible you will get the answers to two questions that are at the core of the Christian faith: Who is Jesus and what does Jesus have to do with us?

Holy Scripture has the power to bring people to faith in Jesus Christ. Those who are willing to give it an honest reading will experience the compelling nature of God's Word. That is because "the word of God is living and active" (Hebrews 4:12). Those who spend time meditating on the Scriptures will experience the passages coming to life. Through the text we see something about ourselves or something that is going on in our world, and we receive insight into how to respond.

Indeed the Holy Spirit is the one who draws people to God. The Bible is like any other writing in its physical form, words that in themselves are simply human expression. These words tell everyone that they have sinned (Romans 3:23), but many do not believe that to be true. The Bible declares that we are separated from God and need to be made righteous before him (Romans 3:10), and that there is a coming judgment of human beings (Hebrews 9:27), but people do not believe this simply because they read it in a book. It is the work of the Holy Spirit, through the Scriptures, to "convict the world of guilt in regard to sin and righteousness and judgment" (John 16:8).

In the month of March may I suggest that you read and study the Gospel of John. The preaching schedule for the month of March is as follows. March 7: John 2: 13-22, March 14: John 3: 14-21, March 21: John 12: 20-33, Palm Sunday, March 28: John 12: 2-16.

Let us have a meaningful, spiritually fulfilling Lent. And again, we pray that we be given the grace to love one another as God has loved each of us in Christ, and to share this love in its truest form as God has intended it to be.
