Sharing Christ's Love Through Service



Karen Pimpo shares a wonderful story: On New Year's Eve 2000, officials in Detroit carefully opened a hundred-year-old time capsule. Inside the copper box were predictions of hope and visions of prosperity from some city leaders. Yet, the mayor's message stood apart. He wrote, "May we be permitted to express one hope superior to all others . . . [that] you may realize as a nation, people, and city, you have grown in righteousness, for it is this that exalts a nation."

What a beautiful prayer! More than wishing for material success or happiness, the mayor's hope was for future generations to grow in justice and uprightness. Perhaps he was inspired by Jesus who said, "Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be filled" (Matthew 5:6).

At times, reflecting on God's perfect standard might feel daunting, but here's the good news: we don't walk this journey alone. Hebrews reminds us: "May the God of peace... equip you with everything good for doing His will and may He work in us what is pleasing to Him, through Jesus Christ" (Hebrews 13:20–21). By Christ's sacrifice, we are made holy the moment we place our trust in Him, and He continues to grow the fruit of right-eousness within us. Even when we stumble, we can rejoice, knowing that God is leading us toward His glorious kingdom where His righteousness will reign forever (v.14).

On January 20, 2025, our nation will celebrate the life and legacy of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.(born on January 15). His words, etched on the wall of the Contemplative Court at the National Museum of African American History and Culture, resonate deeply: "We are determined . . . to work and fight until justice rains down like water and righteousness like a mighty stream." These powerful words are drawn from the prophet Amos, who called on God's people to live lives of justice and compassion.

Amos observed that while his people were engaged in religious ceremonies, their hearts were far from God (Amos 5:21-23). God rejected their empty rituals because they ignored His commands to care for the needy and oppressed. Instead, Amos reminded them that God longs for a genuine concern for others—a way of living that flows like a mighty river, bringing life and renewal wherever it goes.

Jesus echoed this teaching, reminding us that loving God and loving our neighbors are inseparably linked (Matthew 22:37-39). As we pursue a deeper relationship with God, may our hearts also overflow with a passion for justice, kindness, and love for those around us.

The New Year is in the air, and it is the perfect time to reflect on our priorities. Let us take a moment to consider what we value in ourselves and others. With eyes of faith, we can recognize the God-given worth in every person—even those the world may overlook. This is how we joyfully and faithfully share Christ's love—through service, compassion, and hope. May this New Year bring fresh opportunities to grow in faith, love, and righteousness. Let's move forward together, trusting in God's grace and embracing the joy of His promises.
