Sharing Christ's Love Through Service



Dear Friends,

As we step into the season of Lent, we embark on a meaningful journey of faith and renewal. This year, Ash Wednesday falls on March 5th, marking the beginning of a sacred time of reflection and preparation as we anticipate the glorious celebration of Easter on April 20th.

Lent is an opportunity to draw closer to God, centering our hearts on His love, grace, and guidance. In the busyness of our daily lives, distractions can easily pull us away, but this season encourages us to refocus, rediscovering our identity as His beloved children. Choosing to place God at the center is a step toward a deeper connection with Him and a renewed sense of purpose.

A Time for Spiritual Renewal

Surrendering to God's will is not about losing ourselves but about embracing a life filled with grace and purpose. It is a courageous act of trust, allowing Jesus to lead us into Jesus' perfect plan. Lent calls us to seek truth and righteousness, to let go of what hinders us, and to embrace a life of faith and devotion. We invite you to join us for our **Ash Wednesday service at 7:00 p.m. on March 5th**. This service is a powerful moment of reflection as we receive the sign of the cross in ashes—a visible reminder of our faith and commitment to God. As the ashes are placed on our forehead the words are spoken, **Repent, and believe the Good News of the Gospel.** In a biblical context, repentance is recognizing that our <u>sin</u> is offensive to God. Repentance can be shallow, such as the remorse we feel because of fear of punishment or it can be deep, such as realizing how much our sins cost Jesus Christ and how his saving grace washes us clean. The acronym for GRACE is God's Riches At Christ's Expense.

Understanding the Lenten Season

Lent is a forty-day journey leading us to the triumph of Easter, a time for spiritual growth and renewal. The word "Lent" originates from the Anglo-Saxon word lenchten, meaning "spring," signifying new beginnings. Historically, Lent was a time of fasting and preparation for baptism, evolving into a season of reflection and penitence, reminding us of our need for God's grace.

Yet, Lent is not solely about sacrifice—it is also a time of celebration! Each Sunday is a "mini-Easter," a day to rejoice in Christ's victory over death. Many choose to give up something as a spiritual discipline during Lent, and while this can be meaningful, let us also use this time to build habits that draw us closer to God. If we are striving to let go of habits that do not serve us, let's commit fully and embrace lasting transformation.

Opportunities for Generosity

Lent is also a season of giving. Everyone, children, youth and adults, will have the opportunity to participate in the **One Great Hour of Sharing** offering, supporting disaster relief, refugee assistance, and community development worldwide. This year's theme, *Be the Light*, encourages us to shine brightly through acts of kindness and generosity. Offerings will be collected on **Easter Sunday**, and all are welcome to contribute using the envelopes provided or Fish Banks.

Reflecting on the Meaning of Lent

Sometimes Lent can become routine, much like making New Year's resolutions that we struggle to keep. But at its heart, Lent is about more than just traditions—it is about deepening our faith and renewing our devotion. When we receive ashes on Ash Wednesday, we make a public declaration of our faith. I remember a young child at a past service proudly proclaiming, "*I'm going to keep this on forever!*" In truth, we are marked forever by God's love, and while the ashes may fade, God's imprint on our hearts remains eternal.

Embracing the Journey

Lent is a reminder of who we are and to whom we belong. We are called to a life of surrender, love, and service, free from worldly distractions so that we may fully embrace our faith. My prayer is that each of you will step into this season with anticipation, using it as a time of reflection, renewal, and growth. May this Lenten journey bring you close to the Lord and your hearts with joy and peace.
