# Sharing Christ's Love Through Service



As I write, it is a beautiful spring day—a season that often prompts us to take on familiar tasks associated with change. As we tend to our homes, yards, offices, and garages, perhaps it is also time to consider sprucing up our spiritual lives.

Do we approach our spiritual well-being with the same care we give to our physical and social lives? Or do questions about our relationship with God gather dust in the corners of our minds, much like the clutter in our garages? One question worth pondering "How do I live in the freedom that Jesus granted through His death on the cross and resurrection on the third day?"

A foundational belief of Christianity is that we are freed from sin, freed by grace, and freed for a purpose—God's purpose. We are liberated from fear, empowered to pursue the path God has set for us.

Consider the story of Jim, a third-generation farmer who found inspiration in the verse from Malachi 4:2: "*But for you who fear my name, the sun of righteousness shall rise with healing in its wings. You shall go out leaping like calves from the stall.*" Jim, vividly recalling his calves leaping in joy after being released from their stalls, embraced Jesus' offer of eternal life with newfound understanding of true freedom.

Jim's daughter recounted this story to Lisa Samra during a discussion about the imagery in Malachi 4, where the prophet urged the Israelites to remain faithful in a time of widespread disregard for God's commands. Malachi called the people to live faithfully, reminding them of a coming day when God would distinguish between those who revered Him and those who did not. The imagery of a frolicking calf conveyed exuberant joy awaiting those who choose faithfulness, culminating in the radiant healing of God's righteousness.

Jesus Christ is the ultimate fulfillment of this promise, proclaiming that true freedom is available to all (Luke 4:16–21). In God's renewed and restored creation, we will one day experience this freedom fully. What indescribable joy it will be to live utterly free! A similar message is conveyed in a story shared by Todd Turner about a town inhabited by ducks. *Every Sunday, the ducks waddled to church, where their minister preached from the Duck Bible: "Ducks! God has given you wings! You can fly like eagles!" The congregation quacked a hearty "Amen!"—and then waddled home, never attempting to fly.* 

Do we hear the message of freedom, but fail to live it out? Christian freedom liberates us from the power of sin, yet many continue to live as if shackled, unable—or unwilling—to embrace the liberty Jesus offers.

If you or someone you know is seeking a deeper understanding of how to live freely through faith, you are warmly invited to participate in the **Interfaith Dialogue on Freedom**, hosted by **United Presbyterian Church** on **Saturday, May 17, from 10:30 AM to 12:00 noon**, in the Fellowship Hall. This community event will feature discussion circles where participants from diverse faith traditions—including Christian, Hindu, Agnostic, Atheist, Searching, and Islamic backgrounds—will respectfully share perspectives on freedom. As moderator, I will guide the conversation with open-ended prompts such as, "What is your faith-based perspective on freedom?" All who are open to listening and learning in a spirit of respect are welcome. Children under 14 must be accompanied by an adult.

The Adult Sunday School class that meets in the Parlor on Sunday mornings at 9:00 AM is studying the RightNow media series <u>Keys to Freedom</u>. Please join us.

Freedom is not merely the absence of chains but the presence of purpose. As spring brings renewal to the earth, may we also renew our commitment to live boldly in the freedom Christ offers. Will we settle for waddling through life, or will we stretch our wings and soar?

## Christian Nurture – Tiffany Dauer/Danielle Giesler

1)Christian Nurture recommends that the youth be able to attend the youth retreat in Bismarck ND May 2nd - 4<sup>th</sup>, 2025. The cost is \$50 per youth. Christian nurture recommends covering \$30 per youth for the retreat out of the youth fund. The family would need to cover the other \$20.

2)Christian Nurture recommends that the children and youth be able to go to Party Crashers (date to be determined). The committee recommends that instead of scheduling as a "party" we go doing open jump and pay \$10 per child out of the CN budget. Jerome will ensure that we have releases signed for every child that will be going.

3) Christian Nurture recommends a budget of \$40 per month for the youth group to provide protein-based snacks/small meals (i.e. corn dogs, PB sandwiches, Grilled cheese, hot dogs, etc.) 1x per month could consider getting a pizza for the youth group (recommend going to Papa Murphy's on Tuesday night to get the \$12 large deal).

4) Christian Nurture recommends having a fundraising meal/brunch after worship on May 4th for our children and youth to buy some sensory rich items for children in our Sunday School program. ALL FOUR RECOMMENDATIONS APPROVED
