Sharing Christ's Love Through Service



As we begin a new year, it is natural for us to pause, reflect on what has been, and look ahead with hope and intention. For many, the start of

the year brings resolutions and goals. As Christians, however, we are reminded that our aspirations are not simply about personal success or happiness, but about honoring God and shaping our lives according to His will.

One meaningful way to set godly goals is to begin with prayerful discernment. Taking time to listen for God's voice and to seek His guidance helps center our plans on what truly matters. Scripture reminds us in Psalm 37:4, "Delight yourself in the Lord, and He will give you the desires of your heart." When we place God first, our desires become more closely aligned with His purpose for our lives.

I am especially encouraged by Tiffany Dauer's willingness to serve as our Christian Nurture Administrator of Programming. As we pursue these goals, it is important to remember that the journey will not always be easy. Challenges and setbacks are part of life and faith. Yet we trust that God walks with us through every season, providing strength and guidance. The Apostle Paul reminds us in Philippians 4:13, "I can do all things through Him who gives me strength."

In conclusion, setting godly goals for the new year calls us to seek God's guidance, consider how our actions serve others, and rely on His strength every step of the way. As we move into this new year, I invite you first to pause and prayerfully listen for where God may be gently calling you to grow. In that quiet reflection, ask not only what God is shaping within your heart, but also how that inner renewal might lead to faithful action. Then choose one intentional step—small or significant—that allows God's love to move beyond words and into our daily lives. Whether it is offering encouragement, serving in a ministry, reaching out to a neighbor, or simply showing up with greater attentiveness, these acts of faith become powerful when rooted in prayer. As each of us commits both heart and hands to God's leading, He weaves our individual obedience into a shared witness of grace, hope, and love.
